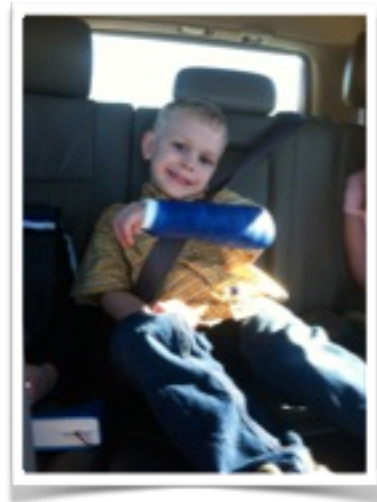
- 100% Support by the end of this year

So often our little Jacob has been a source for adventure in our lives. These last few months have been no exception.... and I mean NO exception! Early in February Jacob jumped from the top of a slide while we were

in Tennessee. The fall caused a minor break in his upper elbow which required a cast for a few weeks. The next week he fell and sheared off the front of one of his teeth which resulted in a trip to the dentist in Virginia and a tooth extraction which he handled like a really tough guy. Two weeks ago we found a doctor in Virginia to remove his cast from his



elbow. The procedure went well until afterward when the cast was off and Jacob began crying and saying that it hurt. He then went into what appeared to be a mild seizure which only lasted a few seconds. When he came out of it, he was lethargic for a while but he seemed fine. With this, we were concerned so we scheduled to see his doctor when we returned to Tennessee. This past Friday we met with our Pediatrician in Knoxville who assured us that this was not a seizure at all but a type of fainting that some children deal with when they are either scared or in pain. We were so thankful to hear that there are no major concerns here! Jacob sure does keep us on our toes!!
